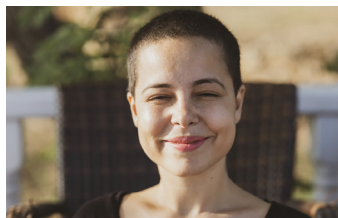

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Catholic Charities of St. Louis Young Professionals Service Day

The Catholic Charities of St. Louis Young Professionals had a service day earlier this summer with the Women's Night Program at St. Patrick Center. This event was led by Mauricio Suarez, one of our Board VPs, and four other Young Professionals. The goal of the event was to get involved with some of the ministries that make up Catholic Charities and serve them in whatever ways possible. They also wanted to evangelize if an opportunity to do so arose.

multiple opportunities to deny Jesus to stay with her family, but she chose to be bold and walk by faith, even though it resulted in her being homeless. It reminded me of the Bible verse "He who loves father or mother more than Me is not worthy of Me. And he who loves son or daughter more than Me is not worthy of Me," Matthew 10:37. Sometimes putting our faith above the people and things we love is hard and at different times in our lives it can be costly. This woman's story gave me a really healthy reminder of the modern-day persecution that many Christians face and a renewed appreciation for St. Patrick Center and Catholic Charities. Even though her family kicked her out, when she spoke about her story and her family, she was full of love and forgiveness for them and prayed continuously for them to have their own faith transformation. I went in to this service opportunity expecting to share my faith through service, but instead I received so much more when I got to see the love and humility radiating from this woman, something I know is a direct reflection of her love for Jesus."



Here is a testimony by Jessica Thomeczek of the event:

"A few of us were lucky enough to get some time to talk with the ladies who attended. I was able to speak with one resident who shared her story with me about why she was in need of St. Patrick Center and it really touched my heart and strengthened my faith. She was not homeless previously, but because her strong faith in Jesus Christ was not tolerated by her family, she is no longer allowed to live in their home. This woman was loving and compassionate, even in the face of adversity. She faced modern-day persecution for her Christian faith and she had

Pilgrimage to the National Shrine of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal

On September 8th, the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Saint Lawrence Society and Friends took a Pilgrimage to the National Shrine of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal in Perryville, Missouri. Father Patrick McDevitt CM, the Provincial of the Congregation of the Mission (Vincentian Western Province) led the day. 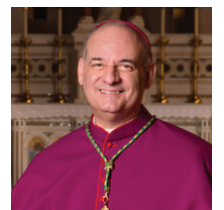
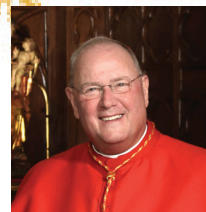

Good News From Our Ministries



It's hard to believe that just nine months ago **Cardinal Ritter Senior Services** broke ground on our Memory Care expansion, and in just a few short months it will be completed. The expansion features two separate communities. Each will serve 13 residents who will require expert care. The homes will offer a cozy and secure environment with open living rooms, a dedicated communal dining room, and a spacious lounge complete with double-sided fireplace and large-screen television where residents can socialize and host family visits.

She received care and support services through a tailored treatment program for her journey to healthy living.

After completing residential treatment, Stacy transitioned into a recovery home, where she continued her recovery journey through on-site support services, including employment support and group counseling.

Stacy attended counseling until she secured employment. She was overwhelmed with joy and graciousness. Finding a job further fueled her motivation to continue on her path to healing.

Her treatment team is elated to see her continued passion and proactiveness for building a life of recovery. Stacy has been a joy throughout the entire process, and we are thrilled about her continued success.



The **Good Shepherd** team works to live its mission each day, but some days are especially meaningful. Katy Stern from the adoption team recently worked with a pregnant mother who chose to make an adoption plan for her baby, then needed additional support when it came time for delivery. Katy picked the mom up, gave her a ride to the hospital, stood by her side and even held her hand as the precious new baby arrived, staying beside her for more than 12 hours so she would feel loved and cared for. In addition to Katy's special care, through Good Shepherd's partnership with Catholic Charities ministry Language. Access. Multicultural. People. (LAMP), this mother received language support from Spanish interpreter Tere Sanchez throughout her pregnancy as well as at the hospital as she delivered. No day is the same at Good Shepherd Children & Family Services, but one thing is sure...we are here to strengthen, heal and preserve families no matter the cost.





In August, **Saint Martha's Hall** held a Back-to-School event at our drop-in center on the campus of Assumption Catholic Church in South County. Because of several generous donations by individuals and Nike, we were able to provide 60 new backpacks, individually packed with supplies from each child's school. Nike also donated various sizes and styles of tennis shoes for kids to try on and take home. Two volunteer stylists assisted with giving free first-day-of-school haircuts, and the Kona Ice truck was available for families to enjoy. Supplies and backpacks left over from the event were shared with Good Shepherd Children & Family Services.



Marygrove once again had the privilege of participating as one of three charities to benefit from the Ascension Charity Classic presented by Emerson as it partnered with the PGA Tour to return professional golf to St. Louis on September 5-11, 2022 at Norwood Hills Country Club. This tournament is a historic event for Greater St. Louis and provides much-needed charitable funds to North County including our kids at Marygrove, Urban League of Metropolitan St. Louis, and Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater St. Louis.

A Time of Prayer for Our Ministries



Beginning in February in 2023, ministry leaders will gather with staff and board members to pray in adoration for the success of their ministries. **One Tuesday morning each month**, a different ministry (see schedule) will come before the Lord in the **Chapel of St. Vincent at the Rigali center** for a half-hour of Adoration, reflections and prayer. Each gathering will begin with the Exposition of

the Blessed Sacrament followed by a brief time of adoration followed by the reading of scripture and a brief reflection. The pattern follows the weekly “Holy Half-Hour” which invites Curia staff to pray for the Archdiocese *All Things New* efforts. Similarly, Catholic Charities leaders and co-workers will gather and be invited to pray for the success of the “One Year Road Map”, which is intended to integrate Catholic Charities more deeply with *All Things New*. All Catholic Charities employees are invited, though the Chapel only accommodates about 200 people. The gathering will conclude with Benediction, a special blessing where the presider blesses those present, making the sign of the cross before them with the Blessed Sacrament.
